NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

- 1) Balance Sheet Cash position is holding at \$3 million over last year. Sales Tax collections of \$650,000 per month going forward until December 2025 would allow for a cash position of \$21,000,000 to hold steady.
- 2) Wells Fargo CD's that mature will continue to roll into the WF Advisors-Cash Sweep account which now has a balance of \$777,805.
- 3) Revenue & Expense April 2025 only. Interest income was \$54 thousand higher than last year. Sales Tax collections were \$75 thousand less than last year. There was a large TIFMAS reimbursement of \$193 thousand in April. Human Resources were \$105 thousand higher due to overtime and staffing.
- 4) Revenue & Expense Year to Date has a \$1,645,606 Total Revenue higher than last year. Net Revenue of \$3,103,911 corresponds to the increase in cash position compared to last year.
- 5) Budget vs. Actual for the seven months is tracking positive on nearly all accounts.
- 6) Checks over \$2,000 are all self-explanatory.

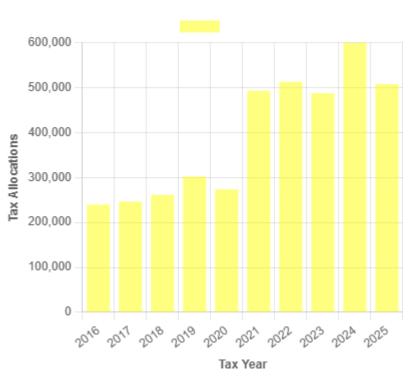
May 2025 Sales Tax Summary

The May allocation reflects sales made during the month of March.

Our May 2025 sales tax allocation was \$507,439 which was down 15.3% (\$91,775) compared to May 2024 and down 2.8% (\$112,801) year to date compared to last fiscal year.

Our top 10 large companies accounted for 54.0%, our top 30 large companies accounted for 69.8%, and our top 100 large companies accounted for 83.5% of our total fiscal year to date collections.

Compared to May 2024, we saw increases from concrete companies, several landscaping companies, and Amazon Marketplace. We saw decreases from the Omni Barton Creek (10%) and McCoy's (18%) as well as no reports from Vaughan & Sons and a large pest control company in the District.

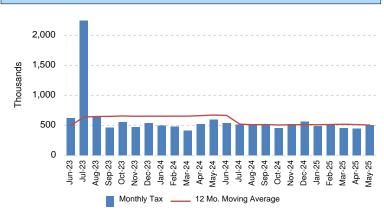

Sales Tax Net Payments Trend



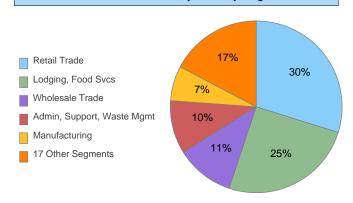
Sales Tax Net Payments Change - YoY

Travis Co Esd 3 - Sales Tax Net Payment Trend

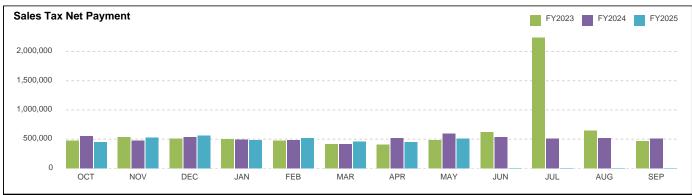

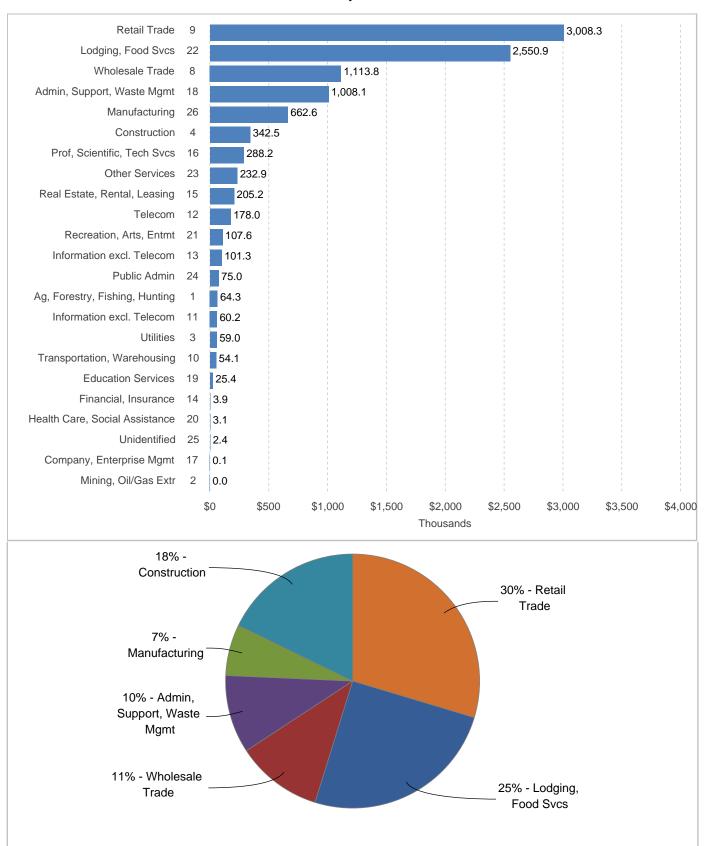

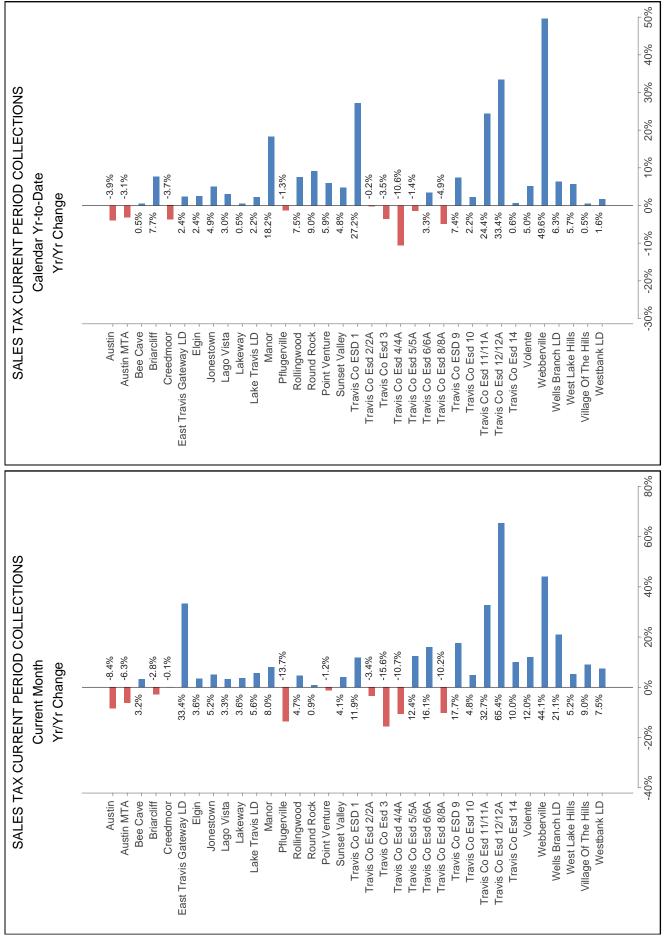

Significant Events

April 5 (A) – Structure Fire – AutoAid Given (Lake Travis) – 307 Winchester Drive [Truck 302] TK302 called out for a Box alarm. On arrival, we had a fully involved home that was a defensive fire. TK302 was assigned Charlie Division from Command. TK302 and crew went straight back to Charlie where E602 was and we tied in with them. We had one handline and water was a problem on the fire. TK302 and E602 worked together with a handline and put the fire out. Once most of the fire was out, we all met in the front yard and worked on getting all trucks back together. After trucks were back together, TK302 then cleared the call.

[Tender 301] TEN301 responded to a structure fire. On arrival, ESD6 was in the defensive operations of a fully involved house fire. TEN301 was instructed to do water shuttle operations as there was only one operating hydrant in area located at ST606. We made roughly six round trips to fill multiple engines and ladder trucks while ESD6 battled the fire.

April 6 (B) – Elevator Rescue – AutoAid Received (Westlake) – 8212 Barton Club Dr [Truck 302] Upon arrival, TK302 was met by hotel staff who led TK302 to the stalled elevator. TK302 made voice contact with the occupant, who did not need medical attention. There was no floor access to the elevator; TK302 was one floor above the elevator, looking down at the elevator cart. E903 arrived, TK302 gave them a CAN report, and they stood by. The elevator technician arrived and wanted to see if he could restart the elevator before attempting a rescue; both units stood by. The technician was unable to restart the elevator. TK302 confirmed with the technician that the power was shut down to the elevator. TK302 Firefighters lowered the little giant ladder down the shaft and placed it on the elevator cart. Two Firefighters climbed down and gained access to the elevator cart through the emergency hatch. The Firefighters repositioned the ladder, lowered it into the elevator, and assisted the occupant with self-extrication. The Firefighters and occupant used the ladder to climb out of the elevator shaft. TK302 cleared E902. After confirming the occupant was OK, TK302 cleared.

April 16 (C) – Vehicle Rescue – AutoAid Given (Austin) – Southwest Parkway & Vega Ave [Truck 302] TK302 was called out for a reported vehicle rescue in AFD box 3701 auto aid. While responding, on scene units called out a size up and asked for the next in Truck to bring cutters and saws. TK302 arrived on the scene and took some tools to the scene. Found a single SUV on its side in a ditch next to a light pole. QNT51 instructed TK302 to cut all the posts on the driver's side. TK302 began to cut the A post and moved down to B through D. After all the posts were cut, TK302 used a ram to push the roof away from the vehicle to make access to the stuck person. After the person was removed from the car, TK302 gathered all our equipment and waited for instructions from Command. Command then cleared TK302 and we returned to station.

April 20 (C) – Structure Fire – AutoAid Given (Pedernales) – 4332 Cypress Trail

[Truck 302] TK302 was dispatched to a reported box alarm in ESD8. While responding, it was reported that fire was showing 30 feet in the air from the house. E802 arrived on the scene and found fire showing from the roof of a single-story house. TK302 arrived on the scene and assumed Outside Truck. TK302 Officer walked up to the Command Post for an assignment. Command assigned TK302 to assist Q603 with overhaul inside. TK302 walked down to the house and made entry from the garage and up some stairs to a second floor above the garage. TK302 found Inside Division and was asked to pull ceiling. TK302 continued that task. Q603 needed to recycle, so TK302 assumed Inside Division. Units assigned while still inside were E801 and TK302. Inside Division had no changes to the operations and had all crews continue the same tasks. Inside Division then requested an additional crew to assist with overhaul and need to recycle E801. Fire was knocked down by this time and all crews had been checking for fire in void spaces. E606 was assigned and Inside Division assigned them to check first floor and attic spaces. I had E803 on the second floor and while they continued to overhaul, they also had a monitor to check CO levels to clear the house. I had a fan placed in the garage to help evacuate smoke. E606 cleared one half of the attic and then repositioned the yellow line to the other attic space and checked for fire. Inside Division then called E803 and advised them there was a lot of water pouring out into the garage from the floor below them. Inside Division then removed all crew from the second floor because we were not sure if the floor was stable because of water damage. I had a crew place another fan on the Alpha front door to help remove smoke from the rest of the house. I then had a crew remove water standing on the floor of the house. Inside Division then called Command to have a face to face and give him an update and show him the area of origin for the fire. After the update was conducted, Command then cleared TK302. TK302 packed up gear and returned to district OOS Decon to clean up and swap out gear. TK302 returned to the station, cleaned up gear and equipment, and all crew showered to make ready for the rest of the tour. TK302 was back in-service after an hour from returning to the station.

April 24 (B) – Hazardous Condition – 9412 El Rey Blvd

[Engine 303] E303 was dispatched to a Hazardous Condition. Upon arrival, witnesses reported that the patient was attempting to perform a "hibachi fire show" when the flames and or fuel ignited his clothes. An attendee pushed him into a nearby pool. Unaware of the specific circumstances that led to the flash fire, E303 rendered medical care. Once Medic 32 arrived, E303 assisted MED32 with medical care until MED32 cleared E303.

[Battalion 302] BAT302 responded to a call with E303. Upon arrival, they had a patient needing to go to the hospital and EMS needed three Firefighters to go with them. BAT302 followed the ambulance and picked up the Firefighters at the hospital. BAT302 cleared the call after returning to District.
